

TECHNOLOGY Q&A

How Can I Help My Kids Develop Good Screen Time Habits?

Set limits. Establish screen-free zones and weekly screen-time amounts. Aim for a balance of activities throughout the week.

Choose age-appropriate, high-quality content. Not everything has to be educational, but when choosing entertainment for young kids, think about how it engages your child.

Watch and play together when you can.

Make an effort to understand -- and even appreciate -- what your kids are doing.

Treat tech as a tool, not a treat. Show them how you can use devices for other tasks, such as sending emails, getting directions, and looking up information. Be a family of media critics. Help your kids think critically about what they watch, play, and interact with by talking about it.

Be a role model. Take an inventory of your tech time and be aware of the example you are setting.



Securly Home allows parents/guardians to control certain access to their student's Chromebook while using a network away from school such as pausing internet access. It also provides a **weekly report** of your student's online activity via their school Google account/chromebook.

<u>Chromebooks</u> are a tool used daily at school and home to access the internet and the **Google Suite** of applications.

<u>Google Classroom</u> is used to streamline assignments, boost collaboration, and foster communication among students and their teachers.

Google Docs, Sheets & Slides are similar to Microsoft Word, Excel & Powerpoint or Apple's Pages, Numbers & Keynote. Students have access to their Docs, Sheets & Slides on their chromebook whether they have internet access or not.

You can view your student's grades, attendance, lunch account balance, and more.

Skyward is the district's first line of communication. Updated information is imperative for receiving school related news and updates.










LEVEL 1

Participants become comfortable in the water learning basic skills. Safety topics include pool rules, recognizing lifeguard, safe water entry, being able to recall name and phone number, helping yourself in an emergency and proper use of life jacket.

LEVEL 2

Participants learn to swim without support. Safety topics include being able to recall parent/guardian names, home address, proper use of life jackets and boat safety.

LEVEL 3

Participants learn to be comfortable with new skills in deep water and learn new strokes. Safety topics include helping yourself and others in an emergency, safe weather conditions for swimming and proper use of life jackets.

LEVEL 4

Participants increase endurance, improve skills learned in Swim levels 1-3 while learning new skills. Safety topics include basic First Aid, reaching assist and proper use of life jacket.

INFORMATION:

- Students must be at least 4 years old to take private swim lessons
- Please enter through HS door 1 and watch for alternative entrance signs posted that may be due to misc. maintenance
- Private changing rooms are available.
- Participants should shower before entering the pool.
- Please bring goggles for your child.
- It is NOT recommended to have 2 children in a lesson if one/both cannot touch in the shallow end.
- Pass/Fail and certificates will be emailed to parents.

LEVEL 5

Participants learn ways to improve efficiency for strokes learned in Swim levels 1-4 while learning new skills. Safety topics include First Aid, throwing assist and proper use of a life jacket.

LEVEL 6

Participants have learned all strokes and will concentrate on refining their technique. Safety topics include recognizing spinal injury and proper use of life jacket.



Early Childhood
