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

Technology Summer Learning

Summer break is rapidly approaching. For our students, that translates into less structured days spent playing, exploring, and learning in unique ways. Nobody wants their child to be cooped up for hours on end connected to a device, however, when used properly, technology can facilitate and enhance learning. Some examples include;

- If you are planning a trip, encourage your child to use Google Earth to explore the destination or Google Maps to plan the journey.
- Create a schedule in Google Calendar with special events, chore charts, and daily activities.
- Nurture a special interest your child might have by encouraging them to create a Google Slides presentation of their research.

Your child's Google Account is available throughout the summer, including access to their Tech/Media Google Classroom. For those rainy days, or daily tech lessons, be sure to check it out for engaging learning opportunities throughout the summer!



School issued chromebooks will be returned the last week of school (seniors' returns will be during their last week).

Students must return both their chromebooks AND the charger that was provided with the device in good, working condition. Failure to return chromebooks and/or chargers in good working condition may result in charges for repair/replacement that will need to be paid prior to receiving the device back in the fall.

Each student will be given the opportunity to describe any pending issues/repairs on a check-in form, but are encouraged to seek repairs via TechSquad prior to the return date.

Watch for fall chromebook distribution dates in the fall newsletter and annual registration information. In order to better serve the number of students, several dates and times will be available to pick up chromebooks before the first day of school.

2022 Holdingford 6th Grade Math Masters Competition

On March 4th, two teams of Holdingford 6th graders competed in Osakis at the annual Math Masters Competition. Holdingford sent two teams this year, each consisting of five participants per team. Holdingford White's team members were; Liliana Henagin, Blayden Nierenhausen, Cole Helback, Seth Hartung, and Max Hommerding. Holdingford Green's team members were; Taylor Strandberg, Carter Kubat, Kira Lancour, Colton Streit, and Jack Wentland.

The day started early for the Huskers as we needed to travel to Osakis for the competition which would start at 8:00 am. Once the event started each of the competitors needed to take a 5 minute fact drill, 3 individual 10 minute tests, a tie breaker, and then 3 five person team tests. A very rigorous morning to say the least. Our Holdingford students did an excellent job of working together and doing their best.

Osakis hosted 67 students which made up a total of 14 teams. Holdingford ended up placing 6th and 13th this year in the team competition and our top 3 individuals placed 11th(Taylor Strandberg), 13th (Colton Streit) and 17th (Jack Wentland) in the fact drill.

I am very proud of our Holdingford Huskers for their hard work throughout the past two months of practice

which took place each Monday and Wednesday from 3:00 to 4:30. Going above and beyond each practice to challenge themselves and their teammates was an enriching experience for their future as mathematicians and Holdingford Huskers.

We expect each child to learn and progress at his or her own pace. Therefore, don't be discouraged if your child doesn't complete all the skills within his or her level



during any one session. Your child needs to know that it is acceptable for him or her to take as much time as they need to master their skills.

SWIMMING POOL EMERGENCY SHUTDOWN

There are a few weather related situations that might cause an emergency closing of the pool.

- Electrical Storm: In the event of an electrical storm, everyone will exit the pool. If the storm passes quickly, lessons may continue.
