#### HOLDINGFORD HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

#### Grades 9 - 12

Course work in grades 9-12 is used in determining class rank and in meeting graduation requirements. Students must complete 26-29 credits for graduation dependent on their graduation year. A semester class is equal to one credit and a quarter class is equal to a half credit. Minimum required credits are in the following areas.
