

HUSKER LEARNING MODELS

In accordance with the Safe Learning Plan for the 2020-21 School Year created by the State of MN there are 5 possible learning models with which we can educate our students. The following information explains those models and explains our plan under each of those models. The specific learning model we will be in will continue to be evaluated on a week by week basis using current trends.

The initial learning model will be approved by the School Board on August 19th.

The following requirements are used to determine models and what it looks like for our district.

Required for In-Person and Hybrid Learning

- Face Covering Policy
- PPE for direct support student services
- Build routines of hygiene education & practices
- Daily cleaning and frequent of high touch surfaces throughout the day
- Building level COVID-19 program coordinator
- Limiting nonessential visitors/volunteers/external groups
- Discontinue large gatherings/activities that do not allow for social distancing
- Monitoring and excluding for illness

Required for Hybrid Learning

- Social distancing of 6 feet at all times in school buildings
- School facilities at 50% capacity
- Transportation at 50% capacity
- Sufficient staffing levels to meet the requirements of the model
