

Minnesota Author Presents to Holdingford High School

Minnesota Author Jonathan Friesen presented to the Holdingford High School and Sixth grade Classes on Friday, March 31st. His presentations were held in the Lowe Media Center (High School Library) and the High School Gym for high school Language Arts class periods and the 6th grade. He spoke to over 600 students in his seven presentations throughout the day.

Mr. Friesen has written seven books and the theme of all his work is “See Me, Make Me Visible”. Mr. Friesen discovered that he had tourette syndrome at the age of six. In seventh grade his symptoms grew, he became the spectacle of his class and then he suffered a grand mal seizure in his classroom, which changed his life. He then spent two years locked in his room only leaving to use the restroom and eat his meals. After a visitor came one day to his room and talked with him, things changed, he went back to school, graduated from high school, went on to college. In college his health returned and he became a teacher and a writer. His main characters in his books generally evolved around someone with a disability.

He spoke to the Holdingford Classes about how important it is that we see each other, especially as students, we can make someone’s life change just by a greeting, offering them to sit with them, and more. How important the small gestures can be in the lives of others, making them feel important and visible.

6th Grade Competes in Math Master's Competition

On March 3rd the Holdingford 6th grade competed in the Math Masters Competition at Sauk Rapids Middle School. Holdingford was represented by two teams, each consisting of five members. The participants of Holdingford White were: Beth Gerads, Marissa Hartung, Tanner Tomasek, Jessica Vouk, and Blake Welle. Holdingford Green was: Kaiden Araskog, Cryil Feia, Alizah Gronau, Blake Scegura, and Abby Streit.

The Math Master's program started at 9am with an individual Fact Test, which consisted of 75 challenging problems. Marissa Hartung had a score of 64 out of 75, she earned a ribbon and placed 21st out of 163 competitors.

Following the Fact Drill, the Holdingford students took a series of three individual tests. Each of these 10 questions tests lasted ten minutes. In the individual round none of the Holdingford participants made it in the top 12.

The competition continued with the team rounds. In each of the team rounds the five member teams had fifteen minutes to solve a series of questions. Each team was given three of these tests and then was scored on the total number of correct responses. Holdingford White placed 23rd out of 34 teams and Holdingford Green placed 32nd. Holdingford was competing against schools such as: Becker, Big Lake, Pierz, St. Cloud, Foley, Annandale, and Sartell. Each school had multiple teams in the competition.

As the team coach, I thought the Holdingford 6th graders performed and competed very well. They practiced twice a week for the months of January and February and into the first week of March, it was a great experience. The students worked very hard and were dedicated to their practices and teammates throughout the program. I am very proud of these Math Masters and I enjoyed working with them a great deal. I wish them the very best in all their mathematical encounters.



7. Please sit on the benches until lessons begin.
8. Be kind to others and follow directions or you will be asked to leave.
9. No loitering in the locker room areas or in the building.
10. You are not allowed to walk around the building with wet swim suits.
11. Take a thorough shower with soap and use the bathroom before entering the pool area.
12. Individuals with skin diseases (such as poison ivy, pink eye, athlete’s foot, boils, etc.) will not be allowed in the pool.
13. No candy, gum, or food allowed in the pool area.
14. Lock all valuables in a locker. Holdingford Community Ed and Holdingford School District are not responsible for lost or stolen items.
15. Parents and non-swimmers are not allowed on the pool deck. They must remain on the other side of the railing.
16. No swearing allowed.

When these rules are followed, swimming will be enjoyable and safe. If these rules are not followed, you will be asked to leave the building.

Swimming Pool Emergency Shut Down

There are a few weather related situations that might cause an emergency closing of the pool.



Holdingford Community Education has made arrangements to acquire the GRASP program for you this summer. GRASP is a correspondence program for grades K-8 which helps students maintain reading and math skills while they are on summer break.

Children receive a packet of materials with a booklet containing 9 lessons. It should take your child approximately one hour to complete each weekly lesson. They complete one lesson a week or work at their own pace, as long as they submit lessons before August 14th. They mail the lessons to GRASP where they are scored and returned to the children with comments.

We also have an online version of GRASP for students in grades 4-8. These students will receive feedback immediately.

Children successfully completing at least 7 lessons with 70% accuracy are awarded a certificate. Those successfully completing all 9 lessons with 70% accuracy receive a medal.

Each child should be placed at the grade just completed in school. If there are extenuating circumstances, order the level that is appropriate for your child. 



Early Childhood Screening

Has your child been screened?

Early Childhood Screening is a FREE check of:

*Height and Weight

*Vision and Hearing

*Immunization Records

*Developmental Assessment that includes:

communication, motor, cognitive, and social emotional skills

Screening is required by state law before entering kindergarten.

That makes it sound as though a child should be screened right before kindergarten.

NOT SO!

Screening is most valuable for three - four year olds.

If a child's developmental delays are not identified until they are about to enter kindergarten. They have missed out on one-two years of early education services that could make a huge difference to their school success!



Scoring is based on the child's age at the time of the screening, so being older does not give them an advantage.

If you are new to the district, if your child is 4, or if your child will be starting kindergarten within the next two years and has not been screened, please call today!




