I. FINE ARTS AND MUSIC

1. Instrument Maintenance Fee: \$40 semester \$60 year non-refundable.  
Charged to students who choose to use school owned instruments. Fee is not assessed if the student owns their own instrument but plays a school instrument at the request of the director. Instrument maintenance fee is to be paid by the end of the second week of the semester or school year.

II. MSHSL ACTIVITIES

Initial Participation Fee: \$100 season grades 9-12, \$75 season grades 7-8. Family maximum: \$400 a year fine arts and athletics.

1. Offered by Community Education in a contract with Today's Driving School.  
Basic 30 hrs/classroom 6 hrs/behind the wheel

VII. COMMUNITY SERVICES PROGRAMS

1. Swimming Lessons: May be provided through Community Services with financial support primarily from participation fees.  
Non-resident students will pay a \$5 out of district fee in addition to the lesson fee.
2. Youth Sports and Recreation Activities: May be provided through Community Services with financial support primarily from participation fees.
3. Recreational Programs:
  - (a) No transportation will be provided for swimming lessons.
  - (b) Swimming: The school district may provide facilities, Water Safety Instructors, and trained Lifeguards for a winter and summer schedule of swimming sessions.

(c) Baseball/Softball:

I. Along with other governmental units and organizations, the school district may contribute toward the support of youth baseball & softball programs organized by the various communities within the school district. The Community Services Director will review the program and recommended contribution annually to the superintendent and school board.

II. School district participation in recreational programs sponsored by other organizations shall be limited to the use of facilities and equipment.

4. Compensation rates for instructors/employees in the Community Services Department are to be determined by the Community Services Director with the approval of the superintendent.

IX. ATHLETIC TICKET PRICES

1. Adults; Post High School Age:
  - (a) \$8.00 at the gate
  - (b) \$60.00 for a 10-punch, transferable ticket, to be sold at home games.
  - (c) Year-Long family pass to all home athletic events (non-MSHSL Tournament) will be available for \$300.00.
2. Students; Grades K - 12
  - (a) \$5.00 at the gate; no pre-sale.
  - (b) Year-Long pass to all home athletic events (non-MSHSL Tournament) will be available for \$80.00.
  - (c) Student Pride T-shirts are available for \$25. This will allow free admission to all home games. Playoffs not included.
3. Parents' Seasonal Non-Transferable Passes: Half price season passes at \$4.00/home event are available to the parents of varsity, junior varsity, and C-squad players and cheerleaders. Passes sold through the high school office on a pre-sale, full season basis only.
4. Complimentary admission to school board members, employees and volunteer workers.
5. Ticket and pass prices and policies pertain to regular season events only. Events such as invitational tournaments, MSHSL Sub-Section and Section events are not included.
6. Annual Family Athletic Pass \$300.00. for all home events excluding playoffs and tournaments.
7. Senior Citizens age 60 and older with proper identification are entitled to free admittance at District 738 athletic events, and concerts which are scheduled in the school district. This will not include tournament games or events.

X. SECURITY DEPOSITS

1. The School Administration may require a security deposit prior to the use of any school equipment, such as pad-locks, instruments, uniforms, etc...Deposits will be returned in total, or a portion retained, dependent upon the condition of the equipment upon its return. In the event equipment is lost or damaged beyond the value of the security deposit, the cost of replacing or restoring the equipment will be assessed.
2. Equipment owned by the school district will not be used for personal reasons by any student or employee.
3. Optional Chromebook Protection Plan: Annual Fee \$35/students grades 5-12 or \$10 for F/R Lunch Participants. Non-refundable (Approx. 65%-70% savings on repairs)

XI. USE OF FACILITIES

Groups using school facilities shall be assigned to one of the following Group Classifications. Any fees associated with the use of school facilities shall be determined on the basis of the Group Classification and the purpose for which the facilities will be used. Requests must be made through the Community Education office no less than Seven (7) working days prior to the scheduled use. The School District reserves the right to cancel or postpone a reservation due to an emergency condition. Examples include: closure of school by the School Board, or weather cancellation.

- Group A: a) Curricular, Co-curricular, and Extra-curricular activities which are a part of the educational program of the school district.  
Administrative fee to Com. Ed. \$10.00 per class, per event for scheduling Pool/Lifeguard.
- b) Meetings of school related groups such as advisory councils, curriculum committees, parent school groups, etc. No fee charged to this group.
  - c) These groups are required to reserve facilities a week in advance and sign a rental agreement.
- Group B: a) Non-exclusive, community based groups such as Boy and Girl Scouts, 4-H Club.  
b) Non-profit, district based civic groups, political subdivisions, and the like.

- Group C: Private individuals who are residents of the school district.  
 Group D. a) Exclusive, district based groups such as churches, fraternal or service organizations.  
 b) District based political organizations, and the like.  
 Group E. a) Private, profit making or commercial organizations.  
 b) Private individuals who are not residents of the school district.

XII. FEE AND RENTAL SCHEDULE:

 Multiple session rates to apply for sessions beyond 2 hours  
 Fund Raising permitted only if rental rate applies.

Baseball, Softball Field/Track Use Fee \$55/event \$250 season. Fee to be paid in advance of use. If the fields need to be prepped by custodial staff, the renter will be responsible for the fees of \$27.50.

When the School District staff is required to be on duty during the rental of these spaces. The cost will be paid by the renter. See fees listed below.

Additional Costs:

- Custodial Staff \$35/hr During regular Shift, \$47.50/hr Weekend/Holidays/Overtime.– 2 hour min,
- Kitchen Staff \$35/hr – 2 hour min
- Computer Staff \$30/hr – 2 hour min
- Community Ed. Staff \$30.00/hour
- Hallways - To be determined based on area needed.
- Equipment: To be determined based on item. Include rent and a deposit.

XIII. LABOR AND UTILITY FEE RATES:

- a) Labor charge for cleaning will be charged as the actual time spent at the above hourly rate with a 2 hour minimum. Over-time rates may apply.
- b) Labor charge for Lifeguards, WSI, and other supervisors shall be at their current rate of pay as per contract. Over-time rates may apply.
- c) Rental of kitchen facilities requires a Food Service employee to be paid as per contract at the above hourly rate with a 2 hour minimum.
- d) If Renters stay past their scheduled time, additional fees will be charged.

The School Board reserves the right to waive fees for district non-profit organizations on a case by case basis.

Long Term Rental Discount:

Groups that make a long term rental agreement (25 or more hours) qualify for a discount. The discount does not apply to tournaments or special events. This discount is for the facility use only.
