Greg Konsor is a native of Holdingford, graduating from Holdingford High School in 1983. While in high school, Konsor excelled in a variety of activities and athletics. He played football, basketball, and baseball and was a member of the 1981 State Championship football team. Konsor also participated in the musical as a senior and was an active member of the FFA program. He held multiple officer positions and was the FFA president his senior year.

After graduation, Konsor chose to attend North Dakota State University where received a Bachelor of Science Degree in Agricultural Economics. While attending NDSU he was active in the Sigma Alpha Epsilon Fraternity and the rugby club.

After graduation, Konsor became a Peace Corps Volunteer in the beautiful country of Belize. During his 2-year service, he worked on a riverfront beautification project, a community center restoration, the construction of a water collection system, and general education assistance in the primary school.

Upon returning stateside, Konsor began his formal career in the grain industry as a merchandiser with Continental Grain. He went on to work at several locations with the company: Lewiston, ID, Pasco, WA, Portland, OR, and Minneapolis. In 1999, he started working for Conagra Foods under the Peavey Grain Company in Omaha, Nebraska. Throughout his tenure, he progressed through the ranks at the company, ultimately reaching the position of General Manager, a position he held until his retirement in 2016.

After retirement, Konsor began working on the idea that is now known as Art in Motion on the Lake Wobegon Trail, returning to his roots in Holdingford. Art in Motion has now become a regional destination as visitors come to visit the Boho Café, art gallery, art studio, and outdoor Pavilion. Establishment of this landmark destination has only strengthened what Holdingford has to offer as a community.

In addition to Art in Motion, Konsor continues to work on a rainforest reforestation project in Costa Rica on a 100-acre former banana plantation.

Throughout his career, Konsor has served on numerous boards including the Underwood School Board, Minneapolis Grain Exchange Board, and the National Grain and Feed Board.

Philanthropy is at the root of his giving philosophy. Benefactors include Holdingford Historical Society, Holdingford Endowment, Holdingford Boosters, future All Saints Catholic Church, Holdingford Green House and area non-profits.
